Why June?

On June 23, 1969, a spontaneous riot broke out at the Stonewall Inn in response to continued police raids on this and other gay establishments in Greenwich Village, New York. The next year, the Christopher Street Parade was held in remembrance and led to decades of pride celebrations all over the world. Though this was not the start of the gay rights movement, it was a major spark in the fight for LGBTQIA+ equality. *



What does the rainbow flag represent?



The rainbow flag was created by artist Gilbert Baker, at the request of Harvey Milk, the first openly gay elected official in the US. It was first used at the San Francisco Gay Freedom Day Parade on June 25, 1979, and originally had eight stripes. The current six stripe version was created for easier production and the colors stand for Red: Life Orange: Healing Yellow: Sunlight Green: Nature Blue: Serenity Violet: Spirit.

In 2021, Valentino Vecchietti introduced the new

progressive pride flag, which includes blue, white and pink stripes to represent transgender people, a brown stripe to represent people of color, a black stripe to represent those living with or who have passed from AIDS/HIV, and a purple circle inside of a yellow triangle to incorporate the intersex community.
